

Mary DeWeerd's life has always included the love of reading. At a very young age her mother inspired her with books which most certainly propelled her into her career in the library. Mary saw how the programs that the library offered did so much good for the community; she was delighted to be part of it.

Mary found READ Ottawa in 2020 and trained right before the pandemic. Needless to say, at that time there were no new pairings taking place. A year later Mary returned to repeat the training and started to work with her learner, Dahn. While Dahn's goal is US Citizenship, Mary quickly saw that there would need to be much more language acquisition to set the foundation for success.

Communication proved to be a challenge and progress was sometimes slow, but Mary has found ways to help Dahn learn English. They have tackled the farmer's market and the grocery store, bonding over food and recipes - practicing English all the while.

While Mary had some misgivings over what she says is lack of any teaching background, she is a perfect example of forming a relationship where learning grows not only for Dahn but for her as well. She tells of her fascination with Dahn's festivals and the history of her country. "It is very true," claims Mary, "that the teacher learns as much or more than the learner!"

In 1913 Holland High School began in what is now called the Midtown Center in Holland, transitioning the building to the Junior High until Jubilee Housing Ministries purchased it in 2005. Now the Midtown Center houses many local non-profit organizations, one of which is Zeeland Adult Education. ZAE has embraced READ Ottawa as they seek to educate adults in the Holland-Zeeland area. READ'S Pair Coordinator, Richelle Hofman, is frequently meeting with learners, ZAE teachers, and READ tutors at the Midtown Center.

When Herrick Library began its renovations, the Midtown Center became an ideal tutoring location for many of our tutors. The space proved to be quite efficient as many pairs meet after the learner's class with ZAE. READ board and staff are grateful for the partnership with both ZAE and the staff at the Midtown Center in our mission to improve literacy in Ottawa County.
