During his years at the University of Michigan, Daniel Horne worked as an Academic Peer Advisor, helping students choose classes in Literature, Science and Arts. Upon his graduation in 2023 his neighbor, Peg Helmink, suggested tutoring. This started a journey not only with READ but as a paid Middle and High School tutor in math and other subjects.

7 learners graduated out of the ESL Program
4 learners honored by getting their Master's Degrees transferred to the U.S.
1 learner received a Dental Assistant certification
1 learner earned her Teacher Academy certification
1 learner graduated with a High School Diploma



June was a month full of celebration, pride, and powerful moments that reminded us just how transformative literacy can be. I had the honor of attending this year's Zeeland Adult Education Commencement, and it was truly a joy to witness the achievements of so many determined and resilient learners. It was a room filled with inspiration, shared by families, educators, and community partners alike.

We were also thrilled to celebrate Allegan Adult and Online Education with recent commencement. Many adult learners earned their GEDs—some fulfilling lifelong promises to themselves or loved ones. These are individuals who once left school early but returned with purpose. For them, the GED wasn't just a certificate; it was a symbol of perseverance, a second chance, and a step toward brighter futures. Each story, each diploma, represented a moment of pride that will stay with us all.

In June, we also launched our Literacy Champions campaign—an initiative that invites community members to make a long-term impact by becoming monthly donors. Literacy Champions pledge \$100 per month, which directly funds a full year of support for one tutor/learner pair. This includes:

Tutor training and continuing education
Learning materials such as workbooks, dictionaries, and flashcards
Testing and learner assessments
Individualized pairing and ongoing support for both tutor and learner

Becoming a Literacy Champion means investing in real people, real progress, and real community impact.

We're so proud of the work being done—and of the learners, tutors, and supporters who make it all possible. June was a reminder of how far we've come, and how many more lives we can touch with continued support.


