...IN ALLEGAN?



A few months ago READ Ottawa's Executive Director Ally Velderman was approached by Allegan Adult Education. Their story was one of a passion for their students and the aching need these learners had for one on one help. They wondered, "How can we have a tutoring program in our community?" A pilot program was created.

The pilot program is a partnership with Allegan in which READ Ottawa supplies the training and the tutor-learner oversight and Allegan Adult Education provides the resources necessary to make that happen. 11 fantastic people showed up for training and the process of making matches has begun.

Ally Velderman reports, "The READ Ottawa team has been so warmly welcomed by the staff of Allegan Adult Education, as well as community partners like the Allegan District Library and the Allegan County Community Foundation. It's encouraging to watch the Allegan community bring their energy, resources, and hope to the table as READ brings our expertise in training and coaching volunteers to tutor adult learners."

The pilot program began this fall and will conclude at the end of the 24-25 school year. There is already a lot of positive momentum for a future where adult learners in Allegan have the opportunity to receive one-on-one tutoring like READ Ottawa has been providing to adults in Ottawa County for the past 15 years.
