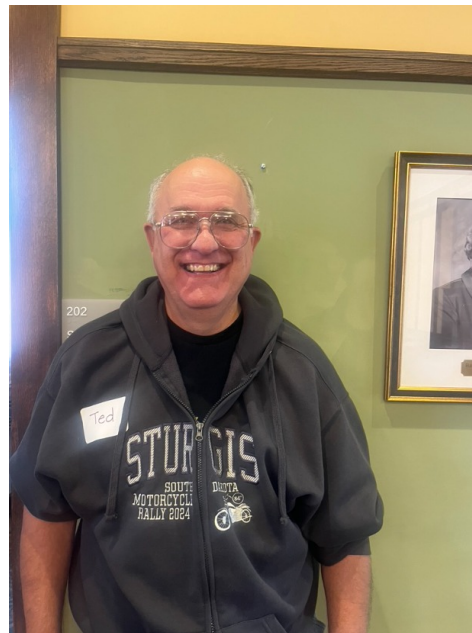

Allegan READ Program spins off on its own



Read Ottawa began a Pilot Program with Allegan Adult Education in 2024. The program was designed to help Allegan create and maintain a tutoring program of its own. Since the short partnership was formed, READ trained 13 tutors and over 150 hours of volunteer work was done. Even more impressive are the learner results:

2 learners passed the GED
3 learners graduated from adult education
and one learner significantly improved his job situation

In just a year and a half this pilot program's impact in the community has created the energy for Allegan to spin the program off on its own. Richelle Hofman's work with the tutor matches has set a solid foundation for Allegan's program to grow. We look forward to news of further impact in the Allegan community as literacy levels are raised with one on one tutoring.
